

# Callander Crags

## Creagan Chalasraid



**Callander Crags**

Embark on a steep climb up to the top of the Crags. You'll be rewarded with panoramic views overlooking the town and the surrounding mountains, lochs and glens.

Mixture of well-compacted surfaces that can be uneven, with some loose material

**strenuous**

2 ½ miles / 3.7 km  
Allow 1 ½ - 2 hours

Starting from Callander Crags car park, just north of Callander town centre, follow the forest road through the barrier. The path turns right, climbing steeply through conifer woodlands. At the top of the crag steps turn left for the main route or turn right for 200m to visit the Queens' Diamond Jubilee Cairn.

On a good day there are breathtaking panoramic views of the Menteith Hills, Loch Venachar, Ben Ledi and the Highland Boundary Fault to the west and north. Return to follow the main route along the top of the crags with viewpoints of Callander. The path meets the route through the Lower Woods and this can be used to return to the car park.



The Queens' Diamond Jubilee Cairn was built in 1897 and stands on the highest point of Callander Crags offering a 360° vista of excellent views. The cairn now commemorates the diamond jubilee of both Queen Victoria and Queen Elizabeth II.
